When I reread the series after a couple of years, I was amazed at the "obvious" details I had overlooked the first time around. Wolfe mentions somewhere that good literature rewards repeated reading, which seems to stand in tension with his statement about half-stoned readers distracted by television.

So, I wouldn't worry about waiting, ruminating, and returning to the series when you do have time--which is what it sounds like you're planning.
