Alas, the real explanation was much more mundane and kind of dumb.

Back in February, my employer changed the format for addresses (so that mine, for example, went from "ddanehy at siebel.com" to "Dan'l.Danehy-Oakes at Siebel.com"). Mail to the old address continued to be delivered, so I could read Urth; but mail from the new address was rejected as not coming from a listmember. The obvious solution -- unsubscribe and resubscribe -- wasn't possible because I couldn't send an email from the old address to unsubscribe.
