On Lundi, sept 8, 2003, at 06:33 US/Pacific, Dan'l Danehy-Oakes wrote: "Well, it's a little more complex than that. They are One, but not The Same. That is, they are distinct persons who share a single substance, being, and Godhead. I'm not prepared to explain all that right now, but that's the actual orthodox Catholic - and, I'm pretty sure, the orthodox Orthodox - position."

It's standard in all existing historic non-Protestant churches, from the Anglican Communion to the Church of St. Thomas of Malabar, bitter theological debates aside. (None had any real theological implications as all evaluated the Trinity in the same way, including Nestorians.)
