You can *search* on any keyword in the book through Google Print. The full text is not available to be read cover to cover, but if you search on the word "Catherine", for instance, you have access to all of the pages with that keyword. In this way the whole book is posted, but only searchable.

Not really. If you search within the book you can get to the rest of it. For instance, with the search 'fechin' I get this results page:
