Right now, we seem to be just getting in the basic factual content. One thing I initiated is putting an "editions" section under each book (I'm not sure if they're there for the books I haven't worked on), so anyone having an edition not so far listed is particularly asked for information.

Also, neither Mo nor I has any of the rarer collections ("Young Wolfe," "Bibliomen," etc.), so anyone who has those and can enter the contents -- it would be greatly appreciated.
