I don't know about that; GW uses addresses/coordinates' subtext elsewhere. However, I think this particular encoding is not right because it has ridiculous precision and insufficient address space to cover 180 degrees nor 24 hours. Moving the decimal to the right helps but leaves us with out of range coordinates; some positions can have both.

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
